Building Season

By the time June rolls around, you can tell it's building season. Hardware store parking lots are full. Drive through a neighborhood on a Saturday morning and you'll hear power tools, spot fresh paint on fences and porch swings, and maybe smell someone's first barbecue of the season. Traffic cones dot the landscape as road work begins (who am I kidding? Every season is road work season in Boise!)

There's something about longer daylight and clearer skies that compels us to fix what's broken, to build what's needed, or to finally get around to the projects we've been talking about for years.

It's true for churches, too. At Southminster, summer isn't exactly quiet. It's just a different kind of busy. While the program year may wind down, there are still sermons to write, ministries to tend, and justice to pursue. There's also a sacred kind of tending that happens more quietly... checking in with one another, making space for prayer and sabbath, sharing meals and memories and hopes for what comes next.

This is building season.

We build faith, not just in Sunday School or sermons, but in conversations around fire pits, in choosing kindness during heatwaves and long travel days, in wondering aloud how God is present in what feels like a holding pattern.

We build community, not through packed calendars, but through showing up: when

someone is grieving, when a neighbor needs a hand, when the Spirit nudges you to write that card or make that call. These small gestures are mortar between the bricks of belonging.

We build justice, even when it's slow going. One letter, one protest, one policy change, one shared story at a time. Justice work is rarely flashy, but it is deeply faithful, and it is always needed.

And sometimes, we build nothing at all... because rest is holy too. Because weeds and schedules and souls need tending before anything new can grow. Even God, after days of creative labor, chose to rest awhile.

So whatever kind of building you're doing this summer, may it be grounded in grace, reinforced by hope, and built to last in love.

I hope to see you in worship, or online, or out on the streets.

226th General Assembly Updates

Wait... we're still talking about the 2024 General Assembly? Yes! After overtures are debated, perfected, and approved at our denomination's General Assembly (which took place June–July 2024), any proposed constitutional amendments must then be ratified by a majority of the 166 presbyteries nationwide.

As of May 2025, all 13 amendments have officially been ratified and will go into effect this July. Of particular note to Southminster: two of these amendments—advocated for by the Covenant Network of Presbyterians—now explicitly include "gender identity" and "sexual orientation" among the protected classes in which the church commits not to discriminate.
