Engaged in the World

In a world that often feels fragmented, polarized, and exhausting, it can understandably be tempting to tune it all out... to find a quiet corner and stay there. But the call of the gospel has never been about disengagement. It's about presence. It's about showing up in faith and with boldness for the work of justice, mercy, and joy.

This past month, members of Southminster offered two more ways of what it can look like for us to show up.

Four of us (Ann Agnew, Randy and Cheryl Marshall, and I) traveled to Washington, D.C. as part of Bread for the World's Advocacy Summit. Our congregation commissioned us for this sacred work in worship, and together we made up the majority of Idaho's five-person delegation. While there, we met with the offices of Senators Risch and Crapo and Representative Simpson to advocate for programs that feed and nourish vulnerable neighbors: SNAP, Modern WIC, the McGovern-Dole International Food for Education Program, and Food for Peace.

And we didn't go alone. We worshiped in a venue filled with people of all backgrounds, ages, races, regions, and denominations... united in prayer and song before walking into the halls of power. That worship strengthened us for the journey. For people of faith, engagement in the world doesn't begin with a political strategy... it begins with the Spirit.

That same Spirit was alive and well at our *All Kinds of Awesome* picnic on the 21st. Planned as a joyful celebration of all gender identities, orientations, and beloved bodies, the event gathered the community for a simple evening of welcome. Lawn chairs and laughter, games and live music, old friends and new ones... all as a public act of affirmation that everyone belongs. This was a time of fellowship more than an act of worship, but make no mistake: *this* was church. And it didn't go unnoticed! Our *All Kinds of Awesome* event was picked up by Religion News Service, which is essentially the Associated Press for the faith world.

At Southminster, we don't believe engagement is limited to a ballot box or a protest sign. It's also a prayer. A presence. A picnic. A willingness to show up for one another and for the world God so loves.

Let's keep showing up. Together.

Reminder of Potential Scams

Churches are frequent targets of scammers wishing to prey on the trusting relationships within a congregational community. Remember: Pastor TJ and the rest of the church staff will never ask individual members for money, gift cards, or other favors. All of our ministries, including charitable giving, are through official church financial channels. Helpful Hints:

- Always check the sender's email address. TJ will only email you from his official church email, which will end with: @spcboise.org
- TJ will only contact you from the church office number, or his work cell phone. Both of these are 208 area codes.
- If you ever doubt if a request for information is legitimate, call the church office directly to confirm before you take any further action.
- Earlier this year, a Presbyterian pastor was a victim of an AI-voice scam, where a computer was able to accurately match the pastor's voice on a phone call. While this technology is still quite new and not yet in widespread use, be aware that scammers may someday be able to replicate TJ's voice. When in doubt, hang up and call the church office directly.
