Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. (Galatians 6:2)

One of the most beautiful things about being the church is that we never have to carry life's joys or sorrows alone. In an individualistic, "pull-your-self-up-by-the-bootstraps" culture where even friendships can be pushed to the margins or treated as transactions, I'm convinced that the church remains one of the last places where we can share our lives with compassion and be met with care.

At Southminster, this care is not the work of one person alone, but a ministry we share together—each of us helping to bear one another's burdens in the spirit of Christ.

This month, we celebrate a new chapter in that ministry as our own Shana Woodbury joins the staff as a Commissioned Ruling Elder (CRE). In this volunteer position, encompassing 15-20 hours monthly, Shana will be able to expand our pastoral care ministry, offering visits, prayer, and presence to those in seasons of illness, grief, or transition. She will also contribute to our spiritual formation ministry through occasional classes, retreats, and other opportunities to help us grow in faith together.

At Southminster, care happens in many ways:

Member-to-Member Care: Every time one
of you makes a call, writes a note, or offers a
helping hand, you're a vital part of our care
ministry.

- Deacon Care: our deacons visit, call, bring meals, provide transportation, and organize memorial service receptions.
- Prayer Chain Care: Our email prayer chain, lovingly maintained by member Phyllis Sanderson, lifts up joys and concerns in real time. To receive these emails, contact Phyllis or the church office.
- **SAINT Fund care:** this fund offers direct financial support to members and friends experiencing difficult times. (To request assistance, look for information in the Narthex/Lobby, or talk to me).
- **Pastoral care:** Shana and I are available for visits, calls, and spiritual support whenever you or someone you know is need. (Of course, our other staff members provide this same care to those with whom they work!).

With Shana's commission to serve as a CRE here, we have even greater capacity to walk alongside one another. If you could use a listening ear, a prayer, or a visit, please reach out to me, to Shana, to your deacon, to your pew-mate, or to the church office. Together, we are the body of Christ, and together, we care.

Southminster Receives \$5,000 Wonder of Worship Grant

In 2024, Southminster received a grant of \$1,000 from Columbia Theological Seminary's "Wonder of Worship" program to help us take quick, meaningful steps toward including children more fully in worship. Since then, we've created a new liturgical banner, added children's Bibles in the pews, purchased new child-friendly musical instruments, and produced a how-to guide for worshiping as a family. Those "quick wins" made a visible difference in our sanctuary and our life together.

This summer, the Wonder of Worship team announced a competitive second round of funding geared toward congregations whose initial work shows potential for continued growth and flourishing. We've just learned that Southminster was chosen to receive an additional \$5,000 to build on our momentum! This next phase will focus on creating a more visible, welcoming, and participatory worship experience for children by:

- **1. Enhancing our space** improving our Prayground with new furniture, built-in storage, a soft rug, visual warmth, and better visibility from the sanctuary entrance.
- **2. Expanding creative leadership opportunities** launching a KidsPlay handbell program, adding puppetry, and creating a child-sized podium so children can serve as liturgists.
- **3.** Equipping families adding more children's Bibles, creating family worship resources, introducing small prizes for children's bulletins, and installing an emergency alert system between the sanctuary and nursery for peace of mind.

These upgrades will unfold over the next two years. Each step will be guided by our vision of children as <u>full participants</u> in worship, not just passive observers. We believe that when children are visibly welcomed, given meaningful roles, and equipped to engage worship with their loved ones, the whole congregation grows in faith.

We are grateful to the Wonder of Worship team for their generosity and support of the worshiping life of our faith community. As we move forward, there will be opportunities to lend a hand, so stay tuned. For now, thank you for your prayers, encouragement, and openness to creative ways of worshiping together. May our worship be another way we reflect God's welcome for all.



Advocacy Takes Many Forms

At Southminster, we believe that living our faith includes showing up for justice and inclusion in visible ways. Advocacy takes many forms, from phone calls, to prayer vigils, to public protests. A New Chapter: Snake River Presbytery Approved

History was made on August 23 as the Boise and Kendall Presbyteries gathered in Twin Falls for a joint meeting to consider a proposed Plan of Merger. We are thrilled to share that the motion passed unanimously in both presbyteries—officially setting us on the path to becoming the new "Snake River Presbytery." This request now goes to the Synod of the Pacific, and then to the PC(USA) General Assembly, for official approval.

The formation of Snake River Presbytery is more than a change in name. It represents a renewed vision for ministry together—combining resources, deepening connections, and strengthening our witness as the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) across this region. There will be many details to work out in the months ahead, but for now we celebrate this important step and give thanks for the Spirit's leading. Please continue to keep our presbytery leaders in prayer as we move into this exciting new season of shared ministry.

About Those White Trash Receptacles

You have probably noticed the white trash receptacles around the church. There are six of them in various gathering places. They really ARE NOT for trash, but for recycling items marked in a triangle 4, 5, 6, and 7 on the bottom. Then there are the blue bins for items marked in a triangle 1, 2, and 5. Of course last of all are waste baskets as in the olden days for all the other stuff that will go to the landfill.

Please try to be a responsible steward of our earth and area of it by checking the underside of plastic to put it in the proper bin. The bins should be clearly marked. All you have to do is pay attention.

Other items for the white bin with an orange bag (more orange bags are above the sink in the narthex): Clean and dry plastics labeled 4, 5, 6, and 7 on the bottom, plastic bags, wraps and films, Styrofoam, plastic cutlery and plastic straws.

Other items for the blue bins: Plastic bottles, jugs and jars marked 1 and 2. Plastic food tubs labeled 5. Office paper, magazines, envelopes, junk mail, newspapers and phone books. Clean cardboard without grease stains and metal cans.

What about number 3? Trash it! Items such as children's toys, PVC pipe and shower curtains = trash. Clamshell containers and boxes made to go in fridge or freezer = trash.

We are so fortunate to have a lovely environment in which to live. We need to be responsible for keeping it.
