
Trunk-or-Treat is Coming!

Banned Books Week 2025 is scheduled for October 5-11, 2025, with the theme "Censorship Is So 1984. Read for Your Rights."

This annual event, organized by the American Library Association and the Banned Books Week Coalition, aims to raise awareness about book censorship and defend the freedom to read. Events are hosted by libraries, bookstores, and schools. There will be displays for you to choose a banned book to read. Or google "banned books" These titles are newly banned in 2025:

- Orlando, a Biography
- Never Let Me Go. Ishiguro
- I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings
- The Underground Railroad, a Novel
- Animal Farm
- 1984
- A Clockwork Orange
- Women, Race & Class
- The Picture of Dorian Gray

Sometimes books are banned because of the words, the idea, or the author. In the case of "blowing up Russia: The Secret Plot to Bring Back KGB Terror" by Yuri Felshtinsky and Alexander Litvinenko, it's all 3, as Ali Velshi said when he featured that title on his weekend Banned Book Club segment.

Books are still being banned in the U.S. in droves. However, it's much worse in Russia, where publishing something the government doesn't like can get you killed. That has not stopped Russian American historian and author Yuri Felshtinsky. The co-author of his book "Blowing Up Russia: The Secret Plot to Bring Back KGB Terror," Alexander Litvinenko paid the ultimate price for speaking out against Mother Russia: death by radiation poison. He spoke with Ali Velshi about what he believes is now "a fascist state" akin to 1939 Germany and why "people are so afraid."

There may be some banned books in our Little Free Libraries (LFL) on the Hummel Drive side of the Grove. Donate some or take some to read. That's the purpose.

Speaking of purpose: We need some children's books in the LFLs. If you happen to be downsizing and you would like to give away some children's books, we will take them, thank you very much.
