

## Scrappy, Faithful, and Thriving

A few weeks ago during our Sabbath worship "pilgrimage" from room to room, our charter member of nearly 70 years, Harvey Pitman, shared a beautiful story from our humble beginnings.

Back in the early days, when the congregation was still growing into the vision God had set before it, children gathered for Sunday School in the janitor's closet. Literally. There weren't enough chairs, so Harvey—our first Sunday School teacher—scrounged up seats from around the building and made it work in a space that now holds a water heater. It wasn't fancy. It probably wasn't OSHA-approved. But it was church.

That image has stayed with me: a handful of believers wedged into tight spaces, gathering whatever chairs they could find, because they believed God was doing something worth showing up for.

Last month's "pilgrimage" reminded us that Southminster has always been a little scrappy—not in a "barely hanging on" kind of way, but in a "we will do what it takes to follow God's call" kind of way. When there wasn't enough, we figured it out. When the space was too small, we rearranged it. When the way forward wasn't obvious, we prayed, talked, debated, and stepped out in faith.

We have never been the biggest church in town. We don't have a sprawling budget, a staff of thirty, or a sanctuary made of imported marble. But, we do have something just as important: a holy stubbornness rooted in hope. A belief that even a small group of committed people—with folding chairs, broom closets, and hearts full of love—can create community, and make a difference.

As we prepare to celebrate 70 years as a congregation, we look toward the future with excitement, not because we have all the answers, but because we are determined to remain faithful to the call of being Christ's hands and feet in the world. We have always been a church that finds a way.

And we have countless gifts to share! We have each other. We have a calling. We have a Savior who knows how to do miraculous things with ordinary offerings. And apparently, we have a long history of making big things happen in small spaces.

Here's to the next season of creativity, faithfulness, and a little holy scrappiness.

# Supporting Grace Jordan in a Time of Need

As you know, Southminster partners with Grace Jordan Elementary to stock their school pantry, providing essential food and hygiene items for students and families in need. With SNAP (food assistance) benefits expected to be frozen during a prolonged federal government shutdown, we're preparing for a higher-than-usual demand.

Although SNAP only covers food, we're still collecting basic hygiene items to help families stretch their limited resources further. When we supply shampoo, deodorant, or hand soap, it can free up a family's budget for fresh produce, dairy, and other perishable items that the Grace Jordan pantry isn't able to store.

We're aiming to stock the shelves more fully than ever in the coming weeks. The school social worker and counselor have identified "high need items" for the coming weeks. If you're able, please consider donating from the list below. Items can be dropped off in the Narthex/Lobby during regular hours or on worship days.

### **Treasurer's Update**

With the end of 2025 approaching, it's appropriate to provide an update on the finances of Southminster. Based on our 2024 financial results, our 2025 operating budget was set at \$278,500. The operating budget includes staff compensation, facility upkeep, mission giving, programs, etc.

As of the end of September 2025, our income is about \$9,000 less than a year ago at the same time, while expenses are about \$8,500 higher.

Please prayerfully evaluate your contributions to Southminster and its mission. We are a thriving community. Please help us collectively continue our ministry and mission.
