

What Are You Waiting For?!?

Every December, I hear the same question. The post office. The grocery line. The parking lot to Costco. The baggage check at the airport. What are you waiting for?!?

Most of the time it's asked with impatience, a reminder that December seems built on delays. Lines move too slowly. Packages take their time. Children count down the days as if the calendar itself could be pushed along by sheer will.

It's a funny thing, though: even with all the hurry of this season, the church calendar invites us into a different kind of waiting. Advent waiting doesn't rush or demand. It doesn't pretend the world is tidier than it is. Advent waiting takes the world seriously—its beauty, its need, and its longing—and asks us to watch for how God is moving in the midst of it.

This kind of waiting is hopeful, but it's not passive. Think of Mary, whose waiting was marked by courage and trust, even as she named her fear. Think of the prophets, who waited by telling the truth about the world and insisting that God's promise was more reliable than the powers of their day. Think of John the baptizer preparing a people for what God was about to do next. None of them sat still. They waited, but with their sleeves rolled up.

I wonder what that looks like for us this December.

Some of us are waiting for clarity: a next step, a needed answer, a bit of peace we haven't

yet found. Some are waiting for healing or relief. Some, for a holiday season that doesn't carry so much grief. And some are waiting in joyful expectation: for family visits, new babies, winter traditions, or the simple delight of a candlelit sanctuary on Christmas Eve.

Wherever you find yourself, Advent reminds us that we don't wait alone. God meets us right where we are, even in the shadows. And this community—this particular gathering of people who try to follow Jesus with honesty and compassion—stands ready to wait alongside you.

This month, our worship invites us to lean into that kind of shared hope. Week by week, as we light each Advent candle, we're reminded that the light grows steadily, even if the world outside feels cold or anxious. Our ministries continue to embody that light, too: in the care we show our neighbors, in our generosity toward those in need, and in the small, faithful acts that make Southminster a place of welcome and love.

So let me ask you again: What are you waiting for? And how might God be preparing you to greet whatever comes with courage, kindness, and trust? May this season open our eyes to the quiet ways God draws near. And may Christmas find you surprised by hope.


