

Southminster Turns 70

This year, Southminster turns seventy.

That sentence alone is worth lingering over. Seventy years of prayers spoken. Seventy years of hymns sung in joy and through tears. Seventy years of children baptized, youth confirmed, couples married, saints commended to God's eternal care. Since 1956, this congregation has been shaped—sometimes gently, sometimes painfully—by God's persistent faithfulness.

Anniversaries are not simply about marking time. In scripture, milestones are moments to remember and to listen. "Remember the long way that the Lord your God has led you," Moses tells the people, not so they can live in the past with unbridled nostalgia, but so they can step into the future with courage and trust. Remembering is a spiritual practice. It steadies us. It reminds us who we are.

As we celebrate seventy years of Southminster, we'll spend this year telling stories about how God has worked in and through this community. We will give thanks for those who dreamed boldly, who built and rebuilt, who stayed when it would have been easier to leave, who took risks for the sake of love and justice. None of us stands alone; we inherit a faith shaped by many faithful hands.

But this year is not only about looking back. It's also about looking ahead!

A rallying cry for Presbyterians everywhere is *Ecclesia Reformata*, *Semper Reformanda*

Secundum Verbi Dei – "The church reformed and always being reformed according to the word of God." We are called, then, to discern what faithfulness looks like in this time, in this place. The question is less "how do we preserve what once was?" but "what is God inviting us to next?" Who are we being called to serve? What gifts has God placed among us for the sake of the world? What does hope look like in the next chapter of our life together?

Over the coming months, you'll see opportunities to celebrate, to reflect, to imagine, and to participate. My prayer is that this anniversary year will be less about nostalgia and more about renewal, less about survival and more about vocation. That we will root ourselves deeply in gratitude while opening ourselves boldly to God's future.

Seventy years in, and this much is certain: God is not finished with Southminster. The Spirit who stirred this congregation into being in 1956 is still moving, still calling, still shaping us for lives of love, welcome, courage, and justice.

Thanks be to God for what has been. And thanks be to God for what is still unfolding.

In a connectional church like the Presbyterian Church (USA), all members share in the mission and ministry of our denomination for our presbytery, synod, national church, and international mission. The "per capita" donation is a responsible and representative way of sharing costs that equitably belong to the whole Presbyterian community at large.

For 2026, the per capita rate is \$38 per church member. If every member contributes their share to the per capita fund, Southminster can offset its operating budget by over \$5500, allowing more of our budgeted funds to do God's work in our local setting. 
